



This project, which has been declared of general interest, is provided for in the Balearic Islands Hydrological Plan, as well as in the general protocol, signed in 2009, which established the general framework for collaboration in the field of sanitation and wastewater treatment, as part of the implementation of the National Water Quality Plan: Sanitation and Waste water Treatment 2007-2015.

This project is Co-financed by the **European Regional Development Fund ERDF 2014-2020**, within the **Spanish Multi-regional Operational Programme (POPE)**, it contributes to the conservation of the environment and cultural heritage.

With these new facilities, water purification is guaranteed even during peak flows and high season. Thanks to the contribution of the ERDF fund, the treated water will comply with the specifications of the European regulations on waste water treatment, reducing the generation of gases and odours and minimising negative effects on the environment and the surrounding maritime-terrestrial and hydraulic public domain, as well as improving water quality.

The construction of the new waste water treatment plant in Ibiza will improve the sanitation and sewage treatment of Ibiza.

For an investment of 24.4 million euros, the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) is co-financing 50% of the project.

The aim of the project is to ensure 100% compliance with the requirements of Council Directive 91/271/EEC of 21 May 1991 concerning urban waste water treatment.

In order to meet society's current demand, the Ministry for Ecological Transition and Demographic Challenge (MITERD) is carrying out the PROJECT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT IN THE MUNICIPALITIES OF IBIZA AND SAN JOSÉ (BALEARIC ISLANDS).

The planned works consist of the construction of:

- The new waste water treatment plant (WWTP) of Ibiza
- The new waste water pumping station (WPS) of Ibiza
- Impulsion pipe from the pumping station to the waste water treatment plant
- Offshore sewage outfall

Profit made

- The objective of the action is to ensure a percentage of 100% compliance with the requirements of Directive 91/271/EEC of the Council, of May 21, 1991, on the treatment of urban waste water
- Reductions of negative effects on the environment and the maritime-terrestrial and hydraulic public domain
- Improvement of water quality
